Isaiah had spoken of Gods' servant who would proclaim justice to all, not seek to injure or In the servant, harm people until His victory for justice is done. all people will put their hope. (Jesus has won the victory by His resurrection and all people (all nationalities) are welcome to put their trust in Him.

22-37:

When Jesus healed the demon-possessed man who was blind and mute, many people began to wonder if He was the Messiah. wanting to put an end to such speculation, accused Jesus of being a servant of Satan (Beelzebub). Jesus refutes their accusation, The Pharisees, explaining that if that were the case, then Satans kingdom would fall because of its division. No, He was driving out the demons by the Holy Spirit. He then explains His power over Satan and that this has to be true, otherwise Satan would not allow Him the victory.

He then declares that anyone who does not serve Him, is His Anyone may speak against Him and be forgiven, but if they

speak against the Holy Spirit, they will not be forgiven. Because of the Pharisees blaspheming and denying the work of the Holy Spirit, they will not be forgiven. Nothing good can come from them for they are ovil them for they are evil. Jesus then says that on the day of Judgement they will have to face the consequences of what they have said.
