when Christ's return will take place who will pretend that they are Jesus warns them against those who will pretend that they are Christ (and they will be successful to a degree). Another sign will be wars and rumors of wars, famines and earthquakes, persecution of be wars and rumors of wars, famines and earthquakes, persecution of His followers (because the world will hate Jesus and His message and will try and get back through His followers), many followers will fall will try and get back through His followers), will increase and away and even turn on their Christian friends, evil will increase and the message of salvation will be proclaimed to all nations. These are the signs. Jesus challenges them to remaing faithul and if they will endure, they will be saved.

The destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans, was the fulfillment of Daniels prophecy (Daniel 9:27; 11:31; 12:11). Those living in Judea were to leave the area quickly. From that time on, false Christs and prophets and Christs will appear (doing miracles and perfoming great signs), but they are not to be believed of followed! Rather, when Christ returns, all will know in an instant, for the heavens will give the sign. The nations will mourn (because of the impending judgement) as Jesus comes in he sky with power, great glord, sending His angels with a loud trumpet call, to gather His elect.

Jesus goes on to say that even as we recognize the seasons by signs, so we are to recognize the end times. That generation (race of people, actually) would not be destroyed before these things would happen. Jesus then assures them that this will take place.

vs. 36-51:

Jesus warns them to be prepared for nobody will ever know exactly when Christ's return will be. It will happen so quickly, that nobody will even have a chance to reconsider their life and commitment to at the time of Christs return, they will be cast out with the wicked into condemnation.
